

Elementary Dress Code 2019-2020

Hair

- Hair must be neatly combed or brushed at all times.
- Boy's hair must not touch the collar, be in the eyes, or cover the lower part of the ear.
- Rat tails or pony tails are not permitted.
- Sideburns must not be lower than the bottom of the ear and must have a straight cut and trim.
- Unnatural hair coloring is not permitted; extreme hair coloring or styles may be a disruption. Colored hair extensions, feathers/tinsel, or other hair pieces are not allowed.
- Boy's facial hair is not permitted. Boys are to be clean shaven.
- Mohawks are not permitted.

Piercings/Tattoos

- Any items related to body piercing are not permitted. These can include but are not limited to nose rings, tongue rings, brow rings, belly-button rings and earrings.
- Tattoos must be covered at all times.
- Jewelry associated with body piercing is not permitted. These include but are not limited to nose, tongue, brow and belly-button rings.
- Earrings that are extreme or distracting are not permitted.

Shirts

- Shirts must be buttoned except for the top button
- Half-cut, mesh, see-through, and half-cut shirts are not allowed.
- Shirts that expose the mid-section will not be allowed.
- Strapless shirts and halter tops are not permitted.

Pants/Dresses/Skirts

- Tight-fitting pants that are revealing are not permitted.
- Extremely baggy pants are not permitted.
- Strapless dresses are not allowed.
- Skirts and dresses must be no more than three inches above the top of the kneecap.

Shorts

- Shorts must be worn at the normal waistline.
- Shorts must be hemmed or cuffed – not frayed.
- Cutoffs, biker shorts, sweat pant shorts, or a combination of these is not permitted.
- Shorts must be no more than three inches above the top of the kneecap.

Shoes

- Shoes must be worn at all times.
- House shoes or slippers are not permitted.

Caps/Hats

- Caps, hats, toboggans, or other headwear are not permitted to be worn in the building.

The district prohibits pictures, emblems, or writings on clothing that are lewd, offensive, vulgar, obscene, or that advertise or depict tobacco products, alcoholic beverages, drugs, or any other substance prohibited under policy FNCL.

The district prohibits clothing or grooming that in the principal's judgment may be expected to cause disruption of or interference with normal school operations.

The district prohibits clothing or other articles that have pictures, emblems, or writings that depict cults, Satanism, devil worshipping or gory images.

If the principal determines that a student's grooming or clothing violates the school's dress code, the student will be given an opportunity to correct the problem at school. If not corrected, the student may be assigned to in-school suspension for the remainder of the day, until the problem is corrected, or until a parent or designee brings an acceptable change of clothing to the school. Repeated offenses may result in more serious disciplinary action in accordance with the Student Code of Conduct.
